

Annually, Southeastern Montana Development Corporation (SEMDC) initiates public input throughout a four-county region to assist in developing a Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). In the past, we have held community meetings to gain insight into trends, strengths, and concerns in various communities. This year we held in-person meetings to invite conversation about the current state of each community, to discuss how things have changed from last year, and to note what projects are priorities to be completed for the following year(s). These conversations are incorporated into a five-year CEDS planning document created by SEMDC to be utilized in the process to assist the communities in Southeastern Montana.

We find that it is always important to host community meetings because of the changing economic impacts on our region. SEMDC is working with citizens and communities to find ways to maximize positive impacts and mitigate negative ones. The more individuals in each community understand economic change and its impacts, proactively plan, and communicate within the community and region, the better the outcomes will be.

Working Groups

Economy

Car Wash

Build a car wash for community use.

Historical Museum

Continue to encourage the operation of the historical museum. It creates an attraction to assist with people stopping and taking in our community.

Main Street Program

Support the development of a Master Plan for the Main Street program. Obtain grant funds to pursue the plan. Pursue "Branding" for the community.

Signage/Internet Presence

Establish more signage for the town to create a welcoming atmosphere and make services and information more accessible via the internet.

Proposed Economy/Housing Projects Receiving Votes

Historical Museum – 4 Votes Signage Internet – 1 Vote Car Wash 1 Vote

Housing/Quality of Life

Golf Course Trails

Need to be repaved.

Potential for Critical Access Hospital (Feasibility Study)

Evaluate possibility of establishing CAH, assisted living, etc. to create best feasibility and medical services for the community.

Mental Health/Chemical Addition Services/Mental Health

Establish more access to mental health and in particular information about chemical addiction services.

Senior Housing and Housing Rehabilitation Project

Work with CDBG Housing to establish a senior and rehabilitation project for lower-income homes. Also, encourage the development of independent living units.

Trail System

Create a trail system to encourage exercise programs, and better health and mental clarity for residents. Add crosswalks on Hwy 212 to increase safety. Repave existing trail in areas where it is degrading. Create connectivity in trails and sidewalks and incorporate stormwater drainage improvements for the community.

Infrastructure

Broadband/Cell Phone Coverage

Make appropriate officials aware of the lack of cell phone coverage even right in Broadus. Very slow Internet in rural areas and complete lack of internet coverage in some areas other than satellite Internet.

Broadus Infrastructure Improvements

Complete water/sewer infrastructure upgrade in process.

Fairgrounds Improvement

Assess possibility of creating an Event Center that could potentially be used for sports events as well as high school practices. Evaluate options to improve existing fairground/rodeo facilities.

Fire Hall

New Firehall needed.

Landfill Cell Recycling Center

New landfill cell needed.

Highway 212 Safety Initiative

Work with Northern Cheyenne Tribe, Federal DOT, Montana DOT, Powder River, Rosebud, Carter and Big Horn Counties to create a safety corridor plan on highway 212.
